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RISK ASSESMENT MATRIX

Strategies to Control Risks:

- 1. Reduce likelihood: Undertake something that lessens the
- likelihood of something going wrong.

 2. Reduce consequences: Being prepared for when something goes wrong in order to reduce or minimise the consequences.

 3. Remove: The risk is not acceptable, so steps are taken to
- eliminate risk completely.
- 4. Accept risk: The risk is acknowledged and accepted therefore nothing changes.
- 5. Transfer: We will place the responsibility of risk on someone else. (Examples: get the participant to accept risk; use a contractor; get insurance.
